

SEEKING RESEARCH PARTICIPANTS

Do you have a child with Cerebral Palsy (CP) aged 12 to 24 months old?

Many developmental assessments require children to show us what they know by using their hands to interact with toys. This is not accessible for some children with cerebral palsy. We are evaluating how children with CP complete a developmental assessment that has been adapted for motor and vision impairments.





Who can be involved?

- Children aged 12 to 24 months who are at risk of CP, or who have CP;
- Who are exposed to English as their primary language;
- and who have some difficulty with the use of their hands (Mini MACS level 2-4.)



What's involved?

At ages 12 and/or 24 months your child will complete 2 versions of a developmental assessment. It will take approximately 1.5 hours and can be done over 1 or 2 sessions depending on your child.



What are the benefits of the study?

Participation in this study will help to better identify which children experience cognitive delay early, to ensure that they have the greatest opportunity to receive intervention and supports. You will receive a report summarising your child's skills compared to children of the same age.
