

Cognition and Language skills in young children with Cerebral Palsy (CP)



Many cognitive developmental assessments require children to interact with toys using their hands. Some children with cerebral palsy (CP) have difficulty with this.

We are evaluating how **children with CP complete a cognitive and language developmental assessment (Bayley IV)**, which has been adapted for motor and vision impairments.

Who is this study for?

Children with cerebral palsy, or who are at risk of cerebral palsy who:

- aged between 16 days – 3.5 years
- have some difficulty using one or both hands
- have English as their primary home language

What's involved?

- Complete two assessments (standard and adapted versions) over 1 or 2 sessions, depending on what suits your child.
- Receive a brief research report on your child's current cognitive and language abilities.
